July 1 – 5 (Week 1)

Turtle, Turtle

Did you know that 7 out of the 8 species of Ontario turtles are at risk? This week at camp find out why, what you can do to help, and be inspired to take conservation action to help turn the tide for local turtles. Join us as we learn all there is to know about one of the world's most endangered vertebrates and take action to help!

July 8 – 12 (Week 2)

Mud...Nature's Slime
